

Troop 136 Assistant Senior Patrol Leader Duties

Job Description:

The Assistant Senior Patrol Leader is the second-highest-ranking junior leader in the Troop. He is elected by members of the troop to serve for six months before serving as the Senior Patrol Leader for the next six month term. The Assistant Senior Patrol Leader acts as the SPL in the absence of the SPL or when called upon. He also provides leadership to the other junior leaders in the troop.

Reports to: Senior Patrol Leader

These items must be accomplished to the best of the scout's ability, or completed to the satisfaction of the troop's Scoutmaster in order to receive credit for this troop level position of responsibility. The Scout will be expected to complete a "Self Assessment" form and present it at the Scoutmaster Conference upon conclusion of this positions term.

Qualifications for the Assistant Senior Patrol Leader Position:

- Be age 14
- Star Rank or higher
- Demonstrated outstanding leadership skills
- Served successfully for one term as Patrol Leader or Troop Guide
- Be a member of the Boy Scouts for at least one year
- Must have completed or are planning on attending Troop Leadership Training
- Must have actively participated in short and long term camping with the Troop
